Daily Weather Forecast Distribution

Tuesday 8 September 2026

Issued at 1100 LST

General Situation

The monsoon trough lies across the North and the upper Northeast while the moderate southwest monsoon prevails over the Andaman Sea, Thailand and the Gulf. Heavy to very heavy rainfall is expected mostly in the North, the Northeast. The Central region including Bangkok and its vicinity as well as the Eastern and Southern regions will be affected in the subsequent period. This is due to a high-pressure system spreading over southern China, which will move further down to cover upper Vietnam and upper Laos. As a result, the monsoon trough will shift southward to pass through the Northern, Upper Central, and Northeastern regions, alongside a moderate southwesterly monsoon blowing across the Andaman Sea, Thailand, and the Gulf of Thailand. **After that during 10 - 13 September 2026**, the monsoon trough will move down across the lower Central region, the lower Northeastern, and the Eastern into the active low-pressure area over the middle South China Sea. The impacts are initially expected over the Northeastern region, before extending to the rest regions. People in the the lower Northeast, the Central including Bangkok and metropolis, the East and the upper South should beware of heavy to very heavy rains and accumulation that may cause flash floods, overflows and landslides especially along the waterways near foothills and lowlands.

The moderate winds and waves in the upper Andaman Sea are expected about 2 meters high and above 2 meters high in thundershowers. All ships should proceed with caution and keep off thundershowers.

In addition, 11 - 13 September, 2026, the low-pressure system over the central South China Sea is likely to intensify into a tropical cyclone. Please stay tuned for continuous weather updates during this period.

Weather Forecast for Thailand from Tuesday Noon to Wednesday Noon

<u>North</u>	Fairly widespread thundershowers and isolated heavy rain in Chiang Mai, Chiang Rai, Phayao, Nan, Sukhothai, Uttaradit, Tak, Kamphaeng Phet, and Phichit. Isolated very heavy rain in Phitsanulok and Phetchabun. Minimum temperature 22-28 °C. Maximum temperature 31-37 °C. Variable winds 10-20 km./hr.
<u>Northeast</u>	Fairly widespread thundershowers and isolated heavy rain in Loei, Nong Khai, Bueng Kan, Nong Bua Lamphu, Udon Thani, Sakon Nakhon, Nakhon Phanom, Kalasin, Mukdahan, Chaiyaphum, Nakhon Ratchasima, and Si Sa Ket. Isolated very heavy rain in Chaiyaphum, Khon Kaen, Maha Sarakham, Mukdahan, Roi Et, Yasothon, Amnat Charoen, and Ubon Ratchathani. Minimum temperature 23-25 °C. Maximum temperature 28-34 °C. Southwesterly winds 10-20 km./hr.
<u>Central</u>	Scattered thundershowers and isolated heavy rain in Nakhon Sawan, Lop Buri, Saraburi and Kanchanaburi. Minimum temperature 24-27 °C. Maximum temperature 34-35 °C. Southwesterly winds 10-20 km./hr.
<u>East</u>	Scattered thundershowers and isolated heavy rain in Nakhon Nayok, Prachin Buri, Sa Kaeo, Chanthaburi, and Trat. Minimum temperature 24-27 °C. Maximum temperature 31-33 °C. Southwesterly winds 15-35 km./hr. Wave height 1-2 meters and above 2 meters in thundershowers.
<u>South, east coast</u>	Scattered thundershowers mostly in Phetchaburi, Prachuap Khiri Khan, Chumphon, Surat Thani, Songkhla, Pattani, Yala, and Narathiwat. Minimum temperature 23-26 °C. Maximum temperature 32-37 °C. Southwesterly winds 15-35 km./hr. Wave height about 1 meter, 1-2 meters offshore and above 2 meters in thundershowers.
<u>South, west coast</u>	Isolated thundershowers and isolated heavy rain in Ranong and Phang Nga. Minimum temperature 24-26 °C. Maximum temperature 31-35 °C. From Phuket northward: Southwesterly winds 20-35 km./hr. Wave height about 2 meters and above 2 meters in thundershowers. From Krabi southward: Southwesterly winds 15-35 km./hr. Wave height 1-2 meters and above 2 meters in thundershowers.
<u>Bangkok and vicinity</u>	Fairly widespread thundershowers and isolated heavy rain. Minimum temperature 25-27 °C. Maximum temperature 32-35 °C. Southwesterly winds 10-20 km./hr.
